The City of Yarra joins the Zero movement

Last night, we celebrated the official launch of the <u>City of Yarra's commitment to end homelessness</u>, starting with ending rough sleeping. "Yarra Council is proud to have had a long-standing partnership with Launch Housing, whose teams have undertaken homelessness outreach in our city for many years. We were one of the first municipalities in the state to develop a homelessness protocol that ensures a human rights-based approach to homelessness at a local level," said City of Yarra Deputy Mayor Edward Crossland.

From Collingwood to Abbotsford and Richmond to Carlton North, local services have begun collaborating to get to know each person sleeping rough by name, understand their needs and support them to find and sustain housing.

"We know that working with the State Government and local councils is critical to grow housing supply & develop a pathway from rough sleeping to a home", said Launch Housing Chief Executive Bevan Warner.

Yarra is the sixth Victorian LGA to join the Zero movement to end street homelessness.

Sandra's story



"It wasn't easy to find myself at the age of 64 and without anywhere to live."

As a single woman in her 60s, Sandra is part of a demographic increasingly vulnerable to experiencing homelessness in Australia.

Sandra was connected to our <u>Private Rental Assistance Program (PRAP)</u>, which supports people who are experiencing rental stress from entering the homelessness system by providing financial assistance to maintain their housing or establish a new tenancy.

"That's where I met this beautiful lady called Julie, who was magnificent. Every time I called her, she'd answer the phone. And that's when things started to happen."

With the help of our PRAP team and HomeGround Real Estate – our ethical real estate agency, which reinvests 100% of profits back into Launch Housing and hosts a growing number of affordable rate rental properties, Sandra now has a forever home in Melbourne.

"It's really precious. I'm more relaxed, I feel safe, it's my little home. I'm relieved and comfortable".

"Launch was my saviour. That's really all I can say about that."
